

- Liver disease, or severe kidney problems.
   Shallow breath or breathing difficulties.
   A head injury or persistent headache.
   An asthma attack.

- · Previously had a blocked bowel · Previously had an addiction to medicines containing Codeine or Morphine • If you know that you metabolise very rapidly codeine into morphine . Previously had a bad reaction to codeine (a known "ultra-rapid metaboliser" of codeine).
- Or are under 18 years old If you are breastfeeding. ▲ Talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you have....

▲ Pregnant or breastfeeding....
Codeine Linctus should not be used in pregnancy unless the doctor has told you to do so

Do not take codeine while you are breastfeeding. Codeine and morphine passes into breast milk

A Driving and using machines...
This medicine may cause drowsiness or dizziness.
If you are affected do not drive or operate machinery. The medicine can affect your ability to drive as it

- may make you sleepy or dizzy.

   Do not drive while taking this medicine until you know how it affects you.

  It is an offence to drive if this medicine affects
- your ability to drive.

  However, you would not be committing an offence if:
  The medicine has been prescribed to treat a medical or dental problem and
- You have taken it according to the instructions given by the prescriber or in the information provided with the medicine and
- It was not affecting your ability to drive safely.
   Talk to your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure whether it is safe for you to drive while taking this medicine.

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#### Important ingredient information

- This product contains 4g of sucrose per dose. To be taken into account in people with diabetes. It also contains invert syrup. If you have been told by your doctor that you have an intolerance to some sugars, and the standard of the product contact your doctor before taking this medicine
- It contains a small amount of ethanol (alcohol), less
- than 100mg per 5ml.

  It also contains sunset yellow (E110) which may cause allergic reactions.

## 2. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, Codeine Linctus can have side effects, although these don't affect everyone.

#### Important side effects

Codeine is transformed to morphine in the liver by an enzyme. Morphine is the substance that produces pain relief. Some people have a variation of this enzyme and this can affect people in a variation of this elzylire and this can affect people in different ways. In some people, morphine is not produced or produced in very small quantities, and it will not provide enough pain relief. Other people are more likely to get serious side effects because a very high amount of morphine is produced. sleepiness, small pupils, feeling or being sick, constipation, lack of appetite.
